REPORT FROM TOWNSHIP MANAGER

Ms. Elton advised that the Spray Park will open June 7th and summer camp will start on June 21st. Ms. Elton advised that the Township is in the process of cleaning up Ordinances that need updating. After passing at the Bucks County Planning Commission meeting next month there will be an Ordinance for Zoning related to recreational vehicles and driveway extensions. Ms. Elton requested that the 2021 Bid for Sanitary Pipe Replacement project be rejected. This was the only Bid in the amount of \$950,000.

Mr. Glasson made a motion and seconded by Mr. Antonello to reject the 2021 Bid for the Sanitary Pipe Replacement Project. Motion carried by a vote of 6-0.

REPORT FROM TOWNSHIP SOLICITOR

Scott Holbert advised that thru the transition in the pandemic we should be paying attention to the orders from the CDC. We should also be aware that while the mask mandate is being lifting businesses are allowed to have their own requirements.

The plan proposes to subdivide the existing parcel into two (2) lots; Lot 1 will be the existing house and consist of 7,338.74 square feet and Lot 2 will be the new of consisting of 7,446.5 square feet. Lot 1 proposes to relocate an existing shed while Lot 2 proposes the construction of a single family detached dwelling, porch, patio, walkway and a driveway, which are permitted by-right within the R-3 Residential Zoning District. The proposed dwelling will be serviced by public water and sewer. The applicant is also proposing to control stormwater runoff buy installing an infiltration bed on and the Lot 2. The plans also include the removal of a portion of asphalt driveway from the adjacent parcel that encroaches into lot 2.

Vice-president-Murphy made a motion and seconded by Mr. Glasson to approve Preliminary & Final Subdivision for the property located at 909 Pennsylvania Avenue. Motion carried by a vote of 6-0.
